BURIAL OPTIONS - Cremation Only Lots

What is an In-ground cremation only lot?

Single grave lot that can accommodate up to 4 cremation urns.

What is the difference between burying a cremation in a regular grave versus the new cremation only lot?

 In a regular grave, cremations are buried in their own individual cremation liner. In the new cremation only lots we can bury up to 4 cremation urns in one 30" liner.

Why choose this option?

 The new cremation only lots would save your loved ones because the bulk of the burial cost is being paid up front.
 Overall the savings on a regular 2 grave side by side lot to bury 4 urns versus a cremation only lot for 4 urns is \$1,000.

How do I know this option is for me?

 If you know that yourself and possibly your loved ones want to be cremated, this option is for you. Please note: caskets cannot be buried in the cremation lots.
